PORTABLE HEATER SAFETY GUIDE for Propane and Kerosene Heaters

GENERAL HAZARD WARNING

Failure to comply with the precautions and instructions provided with this heater can result in:

- Death
- Serious bodily injury or burns
- Property damage or loss from fire or explosion
- Asphyxiation due to lack of adequate air supply or carbon monoxide poisoning
- Electrical shock



WARNING

Fire and Explosion Hazard

- NOT FOR HOME OR RECREATIONAL VEHICLE USE.
- Installation of this heater in a home or recreational vehicle may result in a fire or explosion. Fire or explosions can lead to property damage, personal injury or loss of life.
- These heaters are designed and approved for use as a construction heater under ANSI Z83.7 The primary purpose of construction heaters is to provide temporary heating of buildings under construction, alteration, or repair and to provide temporary emergency heat. Properly used the heater provides safe economical heating. Products of combustion are vented into the area being heated.
- We cannot foresee every use which may be made
 of our heaters. Check with your local fire safety
 authority if you have questions about heaters
 use. Other standards govern the use of fuel gasses
 and heat producing products for specific uses.
 Your local authorities can advise you about these.
- Carbon Monoxide Poisoning: some people are more affected by carbon monoxide than others. Early signs of carbon monoxide poisoning resemble the flu, with headaches, dizziness, and/or nausea. If you have these signs, the heater may not be operating properly or the areas may not be sufficiently ventilated. Get fresh air at once!



WARNING

Fire and Explosion Hazard

- Keep solid combustibles a safe distance away from the heater.
 - Solid combustibles include wood, paper or plastic products, building materials and dust
- Do not use the heater in spaces which contain or may contain volatile or airborne combustables.
 - Volatile or airborne combustibles include gasolinie, solvents, paint thinner, dust particles or unknown chemicals



WARNING

Risk of Electrical Shock!

- Use only the electrical power (voltage and frequency) specified on the model plate of the heater. Use only a three prong, grounded outlet and extension cord.
- ALWAYS install the heater so that it is not directly exposed to water spray, rain, dripping water, or wind.
- · ALWAYS unplug the heater when not in use.

STATE LAW PROHIBITS THE USE OF THIS HEATER IN ANY BUILDING WHICH IS USED IN WHOLE OR IN PART FOR HUMAN HABITATION.



Risk of Burns/Fire/Explosion!

- NEVER block air inlet (rear) or air output (front) of heater.
- NEVER move or handle heater while still hot.
- ALWAYS locate heater on a stable and level surface.



WARNING

Never leave the heater unattended while burning!



WARNING

Improper use of this heater can result in serious injury or death from burns, fire, explosion, electrical shock, and/or carbon monoxide poisoning.



WARNING

This heater is an unvented appliance and MUST be used ONLY in an well ventilated area. NEVER attempt to operate the heater inside any vehicle, camper or enclosure.



WARNING

After turning unit off, heater will remain extremely hot. Allow at least 15 minutes for cooling before handling and storing.

PROPANE WARNINGS

PROPANE GAS: Propane gas is odorless. An odormaking agent is added to propane gas. The odor helps you detect a propane gas leak. However, the odor added to propane gas can fade. Propane gas may be present even though no odor exists.

- Keep heater at least six feet from propane tank(s).
- Turn off propane supply to heater when not in use.

LEAK DETECTION: Before each use of the heater check all fittings and connections with a soap solution to be sure there are no leaks. Be sure the POL fitting is wrench (7/8") tightened into the On-Off Valve on the propane cylinder. **NEVER, NEVER** USE ANY FLAME FOR LEAK TEST.



KEROSENE WARNINGS

KEROSENE: KEROSENE SHOULD ONLY BE STORED IN A BLUE CONTAINER THAT IS CLEARLYMARKED "KEROSENE". NEVER STORE KEROSENE IN A RED CONTAINER. Red containers are associated with gasoline

NEVER use kerosene that has been stored from one season to the next. Kerosene deteriorates over time.

NEVER use fuel such as gasoline, benzene, alcohol, white gas, camp stove fuel, paint thinners, or other oil compounds in this heater. These are volatile fuels that can cause an explosion or uncontrolled flames. **USE KEROSENE OR DIESEL FUEL ONLY.**

NEVER refill the heater's fuel tank while heater is operating or still hot. This heater is EXTREMELY HOT while in operation
